

Making the Global Fund More Effective & Efficient

The Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria has played a unique and indispensable role over the last decade to ensure that national AIDS programs are effective and meet the needs of the populations for which they are designed. However, despite these directives, several studies have highlighted missed opportunities to support the planning, implementation and oversight of these programs. This has been of great concern to the Global Fund and its partners, who recognize that strong implementation and coordination support are prerequisites for a successful and sustained response to HIV.

Our programming aims to :

- Increase and improve the role and action of community sector organizations in Global Fund governance and implementation, particularly in country coordinating mechanisms (CCMs), country dialogue, and concept note development.
- Increase the availability of high-quality evidence to support advocacy and accountability for community sector actors to undertake watchdog functions such as monitoring and advocacy.
- Increase advocacy at the global level for greater accountability of all stakeholders and for more effective AIDS responses supported by the Global Fund.

In 2013/14, the Global Fund launched a new funding model to guide its grant-making to countries. ICASO has developed a number of tools to help civil society and key populations understand and engage with the Global Fund.
